As the new academic year commences, the Professional Development Service for Teachers (PDST) would like to inform you of the Junior Certificate School Programme (JCSP) professional development supports for the year ahead along with a number of relevant updates.

## **GDPR and JCSP – Register for services**

As per our recent email, to comply with General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) you are requested to register/confirm your details for JCSP services for the upcoming school year at this link <u>https://forms.gle/dUCDYbGBYgGWtrvr7</u> (link also available on the homepage of jcsp.ie) You will receive an email confirming receipt of your preferences. Existing user logins and passwords will remain the same. New users will receive logins and passwords once the form is submitted.

Existing Accounts will be deleted if no reply is received to the form by the 20th of September 2019.

## Junior Cycle for Teachers (JCT) and JCSP

# **Programme Updates**

We would be grateful if you could bring the following updates and resources to the attention of your colleagues. Further information on these and other areas will be provided to co-ordinators at our in-service days.

## Ordering Resources – 4 orders per year without mailing/delivery costs

Orders are placed through this website: <u>https://orders.pnpaq.com/Login.aspx</u> by the JCSP Coordinator (login and password required).

There is no charge for JCSP resources for JCSP students. Four orders will be provided to schools during the 2019-2020 academic year (in addition to the ordering of initiative materials) at no cost. However, additional orders will incur a delivery cost of €30.

# Free Membership of the PDST/ JCSP Library Project Digital Library

Membership of the JCSP Library Project Digital Library is free for all JCSP/DEIS schools. Existing member schools will shortly receive an updated set of Digital Library logins which will include a set of logins for incoming 1st Year students. Non-member schools should register at <u>www.jcsp.ie</u>, following which a full set of student and staff logins will be sent out to you.

With over 5,000 e-book and e-audiobook titles in the collection (with multiple copies of many of these), and with new titles being added on a continuous basis, all schools are encouraged to avail of this fantastic free library service.

## <u>Initiatives</u>

Please note: you will not be able to submit further evaluations or apply for new initiatives until you confirm/register for JCSP services at as per the GDPR paragraph above form at this link: <u>https://forms.gle/dUCDYbGBYgGWtrvr7</u>

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Thank you to all those who have submitted their evaluations. If there are any outstanding initiatives, we would ask that evaluations be returned as soon as possible as otherwise this reduces the number of initiatives your school will be able to apply for in the current round.

We would like to remind you that all monies provided for initiatives must be spent on JCSP initiatives and all monies accounted for accordingly. Receipts must be retained in school and be available on request. Any monies not spent on the initiatives must be returned to JCSP. As part of our auditing procedures, we will, as usual, be asking a random sample of schools to provide details and receipts of their expenditure.

We are pleased to inform you that applications are now being accepted online for 2019/2020 JCSP initiatives. Schools are invited to apply for a Christmas Celebration and a maximum of six initiatives in the school year. Applying for an initiative does not guarantee that it will be approved. All applications are subject to budget availability and receipt of outstanding initiative evaluations.

The closing date for receipt of proposal applications is **3pm Thursday the 3rd of October, 2019**. The Initiative Booklet is included with this letter. The Recommended Materials Booklet, which contains details of JCSP resources to be ordered and recommendations based on initiative evaluations from school's experiences is available to view online at <u>www.jcsp.ie</u>.

Initiatives are designed to improve students' engagement or attainment in an area identified by their teachers. It is important that initiatives support identified targets in the school's DEIS or School Improvement Plan (SIP). The initiative proposal and evaluation forms assist schools and co-ordinators in strengthening the link between initiatives and DEIS/School Self-Evaluation Planning.

Please note that:

- Incomplete proposals cannot be considered.
- In order to encourage you to apply for a variety of initiatives, the same initiative cannot not be granted continuously.
- Initiative funding is awarded based on the quality, clarity and comprehensiveness of the application.
- Applying for an initiative does not guarantee that it will be approved.
- The subvention allocated to each initiative is only an indication of the funding to run the initiative. All initiative grants are budget dependent.
- In relation to Reading Corners, it is not permissible to apply for this initiative 2 years in a row. A top-up grant can be applied for in the year following the granting of a full Reading Corner. There must be a break of 3 years between applications for a further Reading Corner.
- In relation to the following initiatives: Author in Residence, Artist in the Classroom, Reading Medley, Film-making, Handheld Gaming Device or Bodhrán preference will be given to those schools who have not received the initiative within the last 2 years. You may wish to consider alternative applications.

#### **Resources for initiatives**

Following receipt of the letter of approval, you should order the JCSP resources required for running your chosen initiatives. These resources will be delivered free of charge.
